

OUR PASTOR'S MESSAGE



THE JOY OF CHRISTIAN DISCIPLESHIP

Our earthly pilgrimage is a dynamic journey toward divine joy because we believe and proclaim with unwavering hope and confidence that God is with us. He is Emmanuel. When Paul wrote

to the people of Philippi from his prison cell, he had every reason to be sorrowful, bitter and distraught, but the spirit of the letter loudly echoes just the opposite! The power of joy in Paul. He is urging the Philippians to be joyful. Rejoice in prayer. Rejoice in suffering. Rejoice in faith. Rejoice in service. Rejoice that the Gospel is preached! Rejoice and joy appear fourteen times in that letter as if Paul is cheering his dear friends in Philippi not to be disappointed or distressed. The central point of the Letter is "I do rejoice; do you rejoice?"

In the Catholic liturgical calendar, on "two specific Sundays—Gaudete Sunday (the third Sunday of Advent) and Laetare Sunday (the fourth Sunday of Lent)" when rose-colored vestments are worn by the priest as a sign of joy at the liturgical celebrations. It is a brief period of a joyful interruption in the otherwise penitential seasons of Advent and Lent, symbolizing anticipation and spiritual rejoicing while preparing midway through the feasts of Christmas and Easter respectively.

The Pauline theme of "Rejoice in the Lord always" beckons us to be joyful in our expectation of Christ's Nativity and His second coming.
